

K9 KINDERGARTEN INFORMATION

Thank you for choosing K9 Kindergarten; we feel certain that you and your dog will have a wonderful time. Please keep in mind that these classes are available on a first-come, first-served basis. K9 Kindergarten has been training dogs and people of all ages for 13 years here in the Grand Valley. We compete in obedience and conformation with our own dogs and feel we offer the most comprehensive classes in town. We have enough room for 15 student-dog teams per class. These classes run for 6 weeks and are approximately an hour or so in length. **These classes do start ON TIME (please see the class schedule for meeting dates and times).**

K9 Kindergarten holds class at the Mesa County Fair Grounds in the Community Building (C Building). If you are not sure of where this is, please call me and I will give you more detailed directions.

Please do not enclose money with your enrollment information. Because we care about your satisfaction, we ask that you not pay until after your first class with us. We want you to be comfortable with our teaching methods and feel you cannot fully appreciate what we have to offer until after your first lesson. Payment in full is required at the end of your first session, should you decide to continue obedience training with us. *There will be no refunds after this time for any reason, so please don't ask.*

We guarantee our work; however, we do ask a few things from you in return. You must do homework, and we do require your attendance in class. At the first class meeting we cover a variety of different subjects and set the pace for all the other classes to follow. If you cannot make the first class, it is best to wait until the next session.

Please read this information sheet, the enrollment form, and the general instructions sheet carefully. If you have any questions or concerns, don't be afraid to contact me. Hope to see you soon!

Things to bring to your first class:

1. **Your dog** – The first 30 minutes of the first class require that you work without your dog, so please bring a crate or pen to enclose your dog for part of that class.
2. **Water** for you and your dog, and something for your dog to drink from.
3. **Treats** for your dog. Please, nothing hard or crunchy. We want the dog to be able to enjoy the treat without being distracted too much from you. We find that hot dogs cut in half and about as thick as a nickel work best.
4. **Fanny pack** or pants with pockets that you can easily get into to hold your treats.
5. **Training collar and leash** – if you do not have these items, please contact your instructor and I will tell you what to bring. Other required equipment will be explained during the first class and will not be needed until later in training. *No chain leashes, Flexi's or harnesses PLEASE!*
